

SHINE is a collaborative effort to improve children's mental health in Napa Valley by expanding access, raising awareness and providing trauma training. They run a teen-led podcast, SHINEcast, to break down mental health stigmas and share students' real-life experiences.

On The Move





Mentis has long been a leader in Napa County's mental health services, providing bilingual, affordable care for people of all ages and income levels. Their programs, which range from early prevention to outpatient and residential services, are offered through schools, community sites and at their facility in central Napa.

Aldea offers substance use recovery and family services, including treatment, early psychosis intervention, trauma recovery, foster care support and juvenile justice programs. They provide behavioral health support in schools and the community, helping children and families build resilience and reclaim their lives.

Napa Communities Firewise Foundation



"Maintaining historical dozer lines and limited access dirt roads for our fire engines are some of the most important key components to wildland fire containment.

Through this resiliency effort, the purchase of the JD 650 will allow the Napa Communities Firewise Foundation (NCFF) to continue and expand these important fuel breaks on an annual basis. This financial incentive will ensure this dozer program lives on in perpetuity and Napa County postures these essential fire breaks county-wide."

In 2022, Collective Napa Valley launched the Forest Health Initiative, a vital program aimed at improving forest health and reducing fire risks. The initiative includes rebuilding fire roads, strategically planting trees and educating the community on firewise practices. To enhance these efforts, Collective Napa Valley has granted funds to purchase a bulldozer for Firewise, eliminating rental costs and significantly boosting efficiency while conserving valuable resources.
